THE UK MATHS CHALLENGE

Following on from the great success with the Primary Maths Challenge, we entered some of our children for another National Maths competition. Approximately thirty of our Y5 and Y6 mathematicians sat for the National UK Junior Maths Challenge. It is a very tough competition aimed at pupils in Year 8 to Year 5. The top 40% of students nationally received a gold, silver or bronze certificate. I am delighted to tell you that we had some excellent results.

Bronze: 10 children Silver: 5 children Gold: 3 children The most able mathematicians from this first round nationally are selected to go on to further rounds. Vraj was selected to participate in the Junior Kangaroo and Aarnav our highest scoring pupil was selected to participate in the prestigious Junior Olympiad which is a two hour challenge!!! Aarnav was awarded a Certificate of Merit!



Art even in the Forest!!!



This half term Year I have been learning about famous artists. They learnt about different art techniques. The children painted in the style of different artists such as impressionism, montage and pointillism. They sketched and learnt about primary and secondary colours. They read stories about a little girl called Katie, who visited the National Gallery and had adventures in different paintings. The children visited the National Gallery and saw these paintings

which inspired them to write stories about the famous paintings.
The classes have had an art exhibition, exhibiting their art work to the parents.

The children have also had a great time at Forest School. They have used various tools such as palm drills and rubber mallets. They have carried out leaf identification; have even eaten hawthorn leaves and s'mores, and created Japanese prints called Hapazoma.

A Review of The Year



Year 4 had their annual review The parents were invited to watch the children re- enact the topics they have learnt over the past year. Some

of the topics covered were Africa, Ancient Egyptians, Spanish language and artists, Power of Reading books and Shakespeare, The Digestive System, P.E, Tudors and Computer Science-Coding. The children really enjoyed themselves and were proud to show off what they have learnt and the skills acquired.

Year 2 Take Trips In Our Local Area



Year Two went on two trips this half term. The first was to Barnet Museum where the children explored artefacts from Barnet's past through a treasure hunt. We were all lucky enough to re-enact the Battle of Barnet, with

children (and adults) taking the parts of historic figures such as King Richard III, Henry VI and Edward IV. The children learnt about the origins of Barnet and how it became the town it is today. Our second trip was to the Finchley Reform Synagogue in North Finchley. The children were given the opportunity to explore artefacts such as the Torah, a Hebrew prayer book, candles and a Yad (pointing stick). The Ark was openedk and we were shown the huge Torah scroll that is used for services. The children found this fascinating! They also learnt a song in Hebrew.



Oh What A Busy Year!

In May the Y5 children created, rehearsed and performed a fantastic Year 5 review of their year. Everyone worked extremely hard to write their scenes independently. They included: Victorian Life, Street Child (the book), scenes from space, computing, maths, The Highwayman (poem) and many exciting scenarios!

in 'BUNGALOW' The whole show was performed very enthusiastically and was a great representation of a very busy year!
