Article 23 - A child with a disability has the right to live a full and decent life with dignity, and as far as possible, independence, and to play an active part in their community.

WHAT IS DISABILITY?

A **disability** is a physical or mental problem that makes it difficult or impossible for a person to walk, see, hear, speak, learn, or do other important things.

Some disabilities are permanent, or last forever.

A **disability** can be something a person was born with. Or it can be the result of an illness or an accident.


DIFFERENT PEOPLE NEED DIFFERENT THINGS


Schools need

- Make sure the building is physically accessible (ramps and lifts for example)
- Make lessons and activities accessible for all (easy read, sign language, Braille)
- Have quiet, calm and relaxing spaces such as Mrs Puzey's room
- Use special equipment such as a microphone or hearing loop
- Have toilets that are accessible
- Make sure all children can enjoy the playground



Sometimes people with a disability have to do things differently so that they can enjoy life fully — like the boy in the story needed a wheelchair







BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE - FINGERSPELLING






































