

Covid Outbreak Contingency Plan – September 2021

# When should my child self-isolate or miss school?



- Government guidance: From 16<sup>th</sup> August 2021, children under 18 and double-vaccinated adults do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- If a member of your household tests positive, your child will need to have a PCR test and stay at home until the results come back.
- If the result of the PCR test is positive they need to self-isolate at home
- If the result of the PCR test comes back negative your child can return to school.
- However new guidance from Public Health Barnet reads as follows:' PCR testing is strongly advised for all children that are a household contact of a case of COVID-19. Locally we recommend that schools apply this measure (children self-isolate while waiting for this test result if asymptomatic) for household contacts as part of their risk assessments to protect school communities.' At Holly Park we will be following this guidance and it will be in our Risk Assessment.





- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at home</u> and should book a PCR test), <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test.
- If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The
  rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18
  or fully vaccinated but instead should book a PRC test.

### Community Covid Risk

#### Description

#### **Actions**



Low Community Transmission. No School Cases.

- There have been no cases of Covid within school for 10 school days.
- Cases of Covid locally are low and/ or stable.
- Hospitalisation/ Deaths due to Covid nationally are low.

No Covid measures are necessary beyond:

- Reminding children of good hand-hygiene.
- Ensuring good ventilation encouraged where practical.
- Ensuring Children / Staff to stay at home if they have Covid Symptoms (and to book a PCR test).

Staff will continue (voluntarily) to test themselves using Lateral flow tests until the end of September.



Rapidly Rising Community Transmission

- No current Covid cases have been recorded at school, but...
- Cases of Covid are rising rapidly in the community causing disruption to other local schools.
- Barnet Public Health / Public Health England issue warnings of expected local/ national infection wave.

- Ventilation of classrooms increased & handsanitising supervised.
- Large indoor public performance audience numbers reduced.
- Staff-room capacity is reduced.
- Whole-school assemblies are replaced with recorded assemblies.
- Clinically Vulnerable staff meet with HT to review their individual risk assessment & discuss additional protection (e.g. reduction in movement between classes/ groups).

A single child tests

- A single child tests positive for Covid in a
- There are fewer than 5 cases in the year group.
- No other year groups are affected.
- The child self-isolates for 10 days. Learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it as per school policy.
- The parents of the child are contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts.
- Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS
   Track & Trace and advised to book at PCR
   Test. The school will contact parents to
   advise this if close contacts are known.
- All children in that class need to self-isolate whilst they wait for the result of the PCR test and if the PCR test comes back negative they can return to school.



5 children or staff within a year group test positive within 10 days of each other.

<u>OR</u>

3 children or staff in a single Class within 10 days.

- There have been 5 cases of Covid across a year group within 10 days which could mean that Covid is spreading within that group of children.
- As above for each positive case.
- The school will discuss the outbreak with Barnet Public Health or DFE COVID line and agree strengthening protective measures for 10 school days, including:
  - Adapting, Limiting or postponing indoor sporting events, trips, open days and performances.
  - Reverting to all recorded assemblies in classrooms.

Covid cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10 day period.

- Despite the measures indicated above, Covid cases within the school continue to rise within a 10 day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that Covid is spreading widely throughout the school.
- Contact Barnet Public Health to agree further measures, <u>for a further 10 school days</u>, including:
  - o Re-introducing class bubbles.
  - o Re-introducing playground zones
  - Limiting all non-essential visitors to school.
  - o Postponing all non-essential events.
  - Re-introducing remote learning for individual classes for 10 school days considered, as per school policy.

The school will inform parents of any changes to Covid measures should these be needed.
