

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE LEARNING AND TEACHING COMMITTEE

Membership:

- Chair of Governors
- Head Teacher
- Chair of the Teaching & Learning Committee
- Core Subjects Governor
- Foundation Subject Governor
- Wider Curriculum Governor

The AHT for Curriculum or any subject leader may be invited for general discussions. The Deputy Head may also attend any Teaching and Learning Committee meeting as a non-voting observer

Quorum:

Shall not be less than three governors including the Head Teacher.

Frequency of Meetings:

Once a term. All meetings are to be fully minuted.

Terms of Reference:

- I. To guide and assist the Headteacher and the governing body in ensuring that the National Curriculum is delivered to all children
- 2. To assist the Headteacher in the production of the school prospectus
- 3. To monitor, review and recommend whole school curriculum policies for ratification
- 4. To monitor National Tests and other assessment results and evaluate progression between Key Stages
- 5. To review and monitor the curriculum provision for children with additional educational needs in accordance with the Code of Practice
- 6. To oversee arrangements for educational visits, including the appointment of a named co-ordinator
- 7. To consider and advise the governing body on standards and other matters relating to the school's curriculum, including statutory requirements and the School's Curriculum Policy and the school's IDSR report.
- 8. To consider curricular issues which have implications for Finance, Premises and Staffing decisions and to make recommendations to the relevant committees or the Governing Body
- 9. To make arrangements for the Governing Body to be represented at School Improvement discussions with the LA and for reports to be received by the Governing Body
- 10. To oversee arrangements for individual governors to take a leading role in specific areas of provision, eg SEND, English, Maths.

Delegated Responsibility:

- I. To review delegated policies
- 2. To review the policy an provision for collective worship, religious education and to make recommendations to the Governing Body
