Land art - art made using natural materials such as crops, water, stones, and soil, especially in their natural environment

**Sculpture**- An art technique that uses several layers to uncover a design

**Natural materials** - Objects of nature such as leaves, sticks, stones and water.

**Clay** - A stiff, sticky fine-grained earth that can be moulded when wet, and is dried and baked to make bricks, pottery, and ceramics.
