Vocabulary

aesthetics – how pleasing your product is to look at.
batik – a resist method that requires a design to be drawn onto fabric with hot wax prior to dying.
resist method - requires the covering of parts of the fabric in a way that will keep the dye from penetrating.
Applique - To glue or sew fabric to another piece of fabric for decoration.
Design - To create and show ideas for a product.
Tjanting Needles - Javanese instrument for applying hot wax
Embellishments - decorations added on
