Results of The Parent Questionnaire

This week I emailed to you the results of the parent questionnaire that was sent to all parents at the end of the last academic year. There were a high number of returns made which was very pleasing to see. The results of the survey were very positive.

The headlines were:

97% of parents said that their children are happy at this school

98% of parents said that their children feel safe at this school

94% of parents feel that children are well behaved at this school

56% of parents said their child had not been bullied and 41% said any issues had been dealt with effectively = 97%

95% of parents said the school makes parents aware of what is being learned at school

22% of parents said they have never raised a concern and 76% said that concerns were dealt with effectively = 98%

97% of parents said their child does well at the school

96% of parents said there were a good range of subjects on offer at this school

94% of parents were happy that the school tells them how their child is doing

84% of parents said that their child can participate in clubs and activities at this school

88% of parents felt that the school supports personal development

99% of parents would recommend this school to anybody moving into the area.

Air Pollution

Following on from the information in the newsletter last week about the good air quality outside the school, I would just like to remind parents that the idling of car engines while waiting has now been made illegal. This means that if parents arrive early and are waiting to come and collect children – they should switch off the engine while waiting.





School Streets

In September, Barnet Council have been celebrating a commitment to healthier, greener and safer streets in the community as part of World car free day (22nd Sept). This coincides with the fact that we are getting a school Street outside our school to make it car free at certain times of the day. Barnet Council asked for some of our children to participate in a photo shoot with Cllr Barry Rawlings outside the school.

The council's School Street Scheme is designed to create a safe place where children can walk, scoot and cycle to and from school between school drop-off and pick-up times, without the worries of traffic. A time when most vehicles steer clear of the designated street, whilst residents, business owners, or carers of someone living on the street, can still access the road freely at any time, by applying for permits.

Councillor Barry Rawlings, Leader of Barnet Council said "In Barnet, we believe in taking meaningful steps towards a more sustainable future. World Car-Free Day and Cycle to School Week are not just events; they are powerful tools to encourage positive change. We are proud that schools like Holly Park, are supporting initiatives such as the School Street scheme and are leading the way to creating cleaner, greener streets for our community in Barnet. School Streets bring a wave of benefits. Children thrive in healthier environments, breathe in clean air and enjoy active travel journeys – leading to healthier bodies, and happier minds."
