This term the nursery children read 'The Family Book by Todd Parr. This encouraged them to talk about their own homes and the special people they live with. The nursery adults helped the children to find pictures of their own homes using Google Earth and a variety of construction materials were available for the children to build their own house models using the book 'Home' by Carson Ellis as inspiration. Each child was then given the task

of completing an 'All About Me' book with their family which they later shared with their friends and teachers. They also bought in a photo of their family to talk about at carpet time and later to be put on our family display. All of the children drew beautiful family pictures and it was lovely listening to them talk about each member of their family and the special things they do with them.

Year 1 Christmas Stories



Year One have been so busy this term. They have been looking at Christmas Stories, including "The Jolly Christmas Postman" and "The Christmas Story". They became time travellers and went back in time 2000 years to meet the characters

from the Christmas story. They heard how the angel visited Mary and Joseph, travelled through Bethlehem, they stroked some sheep, smelt some frankincense, ran away from King Herod and met Mary and Baby Jesus in the stable, before travelling back to 2024 in time for the end of the school day!



YEAR 5 VICTORIAN DAY

Year 5 have been learning about the Victorians. They enjoyed a Victorian Day. They dressed in Victorian clothes and wrote using a quill pen and ink. They learned to add using old English money - pounds shillings and pence. They created beautiful cards using the Victorian craft of quilling. Some children made Victorian silhouettes using black paper, while others made cup and ball toys, that Victorian children played with.













One of Year 3's Science topics this term has been 'Rocks, Fossils and Soils'. They learned about different types of rocks, how they are formed, which rocks are the strongest and which are permeable. In November to complement this learning, they had a virtual visit from a geologist from the



University of London.
The children were shown

how various rocks are made and the rock cycle.



They also got to see how fossils are formed. They got to use their 3D glasses to look at different types of fossils

Infant Music Festival



This year, the Infant Music Festival was based on the book Beegu - a story about an alien. All of the songs were based on the theme of friendship and belonging. The children learnt songs in Welsh and Mandarin. They learnt playground chants that were fun and catchy! The Year 2 children were brilliant!

Frosty Fun in Reception



As part of their topic on the changing seasons Reception read "Jack frost" by Kazuno Kohara. The children had a wonderful surprise in the morning when they found snowflakes and a present. The children had lots of fun re telling the story using props and they developed their vocabulary using words such as frosty, icy and



shiver. They took part in a range of cross curricular activities. For example, whilst exploring the properties of ice they noticed how and why ice melts. They used their creative skills to make their own Jack frost pictures and used their phonics skills to write captions for the story.

This term Year 4 have been finding out all about Ancient Egypt. The children enjoyed a mummification workshop. The children dressed up as Ancient Egyptians and really looked the part, looking very regal and authentic.

Year 4 also had a trip to the British Museum where they looked at lots of Egyptian artefacts. As part of the whole school Cultural Day, they continued the Egyptian theme and had a dance workshop where they learned some lovely Egyptian dances which they performed to each other.

In November, Year 6 went on a trip to the Imperial War Museum. This was to support the work they have been doing in History (and now Geography) on World War Two. They visited the World War 1 and World War 2 galleries where they explored all the exhibits - including an Anderson Shelter. They also had time to explore other areas of the museum. Behaviour was excellent and it was a very enjoyable visit.







At the end of November, Year 6 were treated to a fantastic World War 2 dance workshop. The children were able to learn three dances that were popular during World War 2: The Lindy Hop, The Lambeth Walk and The Charleston. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the experience.





Y2 GO DOTTY!



The Year Two children have been learning about how artists use colours in their work. They studied the work of Yayoi Kusama and discovered that she used lots of bright colours with dots everywhere. One day the children arrived at school and their classrooms were full of dots, on the floor, on the ceiling, all over the walls and even on chairs

and tables. The children then created their own pieces of 3D art by adding dots to objects from home. They used fabric, paints and different types of pen to add the dots. They also created 2D artwork in the style of Yayoi Kusama, using fruit and vegetables as inspiration and adding dots of different sizes and colours.





Noah's Ark Local Charity

This Term we supported a local charity. We supported Noah's Ark Children's Hospice in Barnet. In October Holly Park families raised a very generous £1,217 for the charity as part of the charities national campaign where all money was doubled. In November we raised £306 through our local charity day where children came dressed as animals off the Ark. Noah's Ark attended our Christmas fair and raised a further £166 on their stall. At the end of term 12 KS2 children visited the Ark to see the wonderful work they do. It is a fabulous place!
