Online Safety Next week - Parent Session Friday 7th February

Children's Mental Health Week

The week beginning 3rd February is Children's Mental Health Week. The theme is **-Know Yourself, Grow Yourself.**

There will be an assembly at the start of that week where the wellbeing champions will lead the assembly. Miss Michael will lead a Zones of Regulation pathway assembly about emotions and the stages/pathway children will use to help themselves out of a situation. She will talk about which tools children might choose to use to help them. In class there will be a talk time to consolidate this further.

There will be a homework for children to do with parents – which will be about practicing some of the tools children can use.

There will be a **Dress To Express Day on Wednesday 5th February** where children reflect on themselves and their personality and dress to express themselves. This is an opportunity for self-expression and celebrating a range of emotions. Children can come dressed in their favourite colour or their favourite outfit or a fancy-dress outfit – anything that makes them smile and reflects their personality.




The Potato Olympics


On Monday we have our annual 'House Challenge' This is an opportunity for children to work together in their house teams to earn points for their house.

Science Workshops (Year I - Year 6)

We are very pleased to be having a Holly Park Science Week for the whole week beginning Monday 24th February. During our Science Week the children will be doing some science experiments in class, there will be science assemblies and there will be a science homework.

Mrs Smith (Y4 Sycamore teacher) is our Holly Park science leader. Mrs Smith has booked a very exciting workshop for all of the classes from Year I to Year 6 on Thursday 27th February.

Children will get to engage in a selection of experiments that may include:

- Cloud in a Bottle
- Balloon Experiments
- Mutant Ninja Germs
- Bouncing Bubbles
- Fire Tornado

The children will engage in critical thinking, observation & analysis and teamwork.

The cost for the day is very expensive and we are aware that parents already pay for the curriculum days and trips that are planned for the year group.

I am very pleased to let you know that The PTA committee have agreed to heavily subsidise these workshops with money raised from PTA events. The PTA are contributing £700 to the cost of the day.

This means that we are only asking parents for $\pounds I$ per child in order to participate in these exciting science workshops. We hope that the science workshops will be enjoyable and educational and we are grateful to the PTA for their financial support to enable this event to happen.
