What will we be doing this term?

Yet again we are in for a very busy term! Before Easter we planted red sunflowers and we are continuing to watch them grow. We are also continuing to work on our number and mark making skills that were explained in our Spring Newsletter. Here are some of the things we will be doing this term: We will be reading the story The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle. This story is great for expanding vocabulary and also helps with counting skills. The most exciting part of this topic will definitely be having our very own caterpillars that we will watch grow into Chrysalis's and then become butterflies! The children will be learning about the life cycle of a butterfly as well as re-telling the story by creating their own story pictures.

As part of our 'What is the world?' geography topic we will be meeting Barnaby Bear and travelling with him to different countries. We will learn about look at maps of the world and find out what it is like to live in countries such as Italy and Japan. We will explore food, music, animals, transport and famous buildings.

This is a beautiful book that promotes kindness but will also get the children thinking about what is special to them. What objects are special to them? What people are special to them? What places are special to them? Why?

We will be looking at different jobs and in particular the people who help us such as the police, teachers, bus drivers, dentists and doctors. We will be exploring what they do day to day and the equipment they use. The children will be able to share their own experiences that they have had with these people.
