They used binoculars to get a clearer view, and compasses to tell the direction. They went to the boating lake, where the children drew a map of the area, including a key to its main features.

They also interviewed members of the public, asking them about their use of the park. After lunch, the children described similarities and differences between the hill and a mountain they had learned about – Scafell Pike.




### Nursery Adventures!
