NURSERY NOISE



The children have been exploring the wonderful world of sound through the story 'What's That Noise? After hearing about a boy with a box full of noise, each child decorated their own special box and filled it with items that made different sounds. They enjoyed listening walks around the school, talking about the noises they could hear, and played sound lotto games to help recognise familiar sounds, including those made by animals.

They also explored different musical instruments and created their own. They used them for a joyful singing session during carpet time. They also enjoyed using their voices and bodies to make different noises too.

Year 1 Immersive Experience



In RE Year One have been learning about celebrations. As part of this work, they visited Christ Church in North Finchley to experience the Christmas story from 2000 years ago. The children were dressed in shepherd's outfits and went in a time machine which took them back to the year 0. From the time machine they met loseph the carpenter, a shepherd on the hillside, a wise man, King Herod and finally, Mary and the baby Jesus. It was a really interactive and immersive experience and the children learnt a lot about why Christians celebrate Christmas.





YEAR 5 VICTORIAN DAY

Year 5 had a wonderful Victorian curriculum day. The children dressed up in Victorian costumes, and looked fantastic. The teachers were very strict that day! Children chanted times tables and children had to wear the dunce's hat! They learned to write with a quill and ink, and practised old-fashioned handwriting. They enjoyed doing several Victorian crafts, including paper quillng, creating silhouette portraits, and making a cup and ball game.









Y3 Scientists

Year 3 have been learning about 'Rocks, Fossils and Soils' in science. They learned about different types of rocks, how they are formed, which rocks are the strongest and which are permeable. In November they had a virtual visit from a geologist from the University of London.



The children were shown how various

rocks are made and the rock cycle. They also



got to see how fossils are formed. They got to use their 3D glasses to look at different types of fossils

Reception Frosty Fun!



As part of their topic on the changing seasons Reception read "Jack frost" by Kazuno Kohara. The children had a wonderful surprise in the morning when they found snowflakes and a present. The children had lots of fun re telling the story using props and they developed their vocabulary using words such as frosty, icy and hibernating. They took



part in a range of cross curricular activities. For example, whilst exploring the properties of ice they noticed how and why ice melts. They used their creative skills to make their own Jack frost pictures and used their phonics skills to write captions for the story.

Year 4 had a brilliant time learning more about Ancient Egypt on their trip to the British Museum. They were particularly impressed at being able to see the Rosetta Stone up close as well as the magnificent statues, hieroglyphics and sarcophagi on display. They also took part in a mummification workshop at the museum and followed this up at school by writing some fantastically detailed instructions about how to make a mummy. The children

have all been so enthusiastic about this topic and have produced some excellent related work.



Cultural Day





For our annual Cultural Day event, the children came dressed to represent their cultural heritage. Y2 FIELD TRIP



Year 2 enjoyed a field trip to Arnos Park, where they put their geography skills into action. They followed a route on a map to the park. Along the way, the children spotted lots of different bridges, learning about their features and purposes. These included railway bridges with strong arches, footbridges crossing over streams, and even an aqueduct which helps underground trains travel over the park. The children observed closely and sketched all of the bridges.

This is a charity that provides opportunities and support to Barnet's looked-after children and young care leavers, empowering them to live their best lives.
