

Communication

Whilst there were some individual comments about how the school could improve communication, there was one overwhelming comment that came up several times that parents felt could be improved and could be a barrier for parents. Many parents felt that with only one parent getting the information via text or email was a problem and that it would be much better if both parents got the information.

We have looked into this as our contract with the text/email provider has just come to an end. It will cost the school another £1,500 on top of what we already pay in order to allow a larger access e.g both parents to have access. As you know, school budgets are VERY tight – however we have listened to parent feedback and feel that this will be money well spent and we have extended our contract so that all parents can get communications. We hope that parents will appreciate that we have listened to feedback and that this will make things easier for families.

Spread Your Wings (national Charity) Blue Day Friday 13th February


On Friday next week we will be supporting our national charity – Spread Your Wings.

Spread Your Wings is a charity that supports children with Angelman Syndrome.

Spread your wings is a charity close to our school community as Alex who runs Non-Stop Action has a son with Angelman's Syndrome.

Angelman Syndrome (AS) is a rare neurogenetic condition affecting around 1 in 15,000 people, about 500,000 in the world. It affects the nervous system causing severe physical and learning disabilities, little or no speech and issues with movement and balance. A person with Angelman will have near normal life expectancy, but they will require support throughout their life. AS is caused by one of several different types of disruptions of a region of Chromosome 15, all involving a single gene, UBE3A. AS or Angelman Syndrome, was given its name by a British paediatrician, Harry Angelman. He first identified it in 1965. Initially, little was known of the disorder and few other cases were identified. February is rare diseases month and the 15th February is designated as Angelman Day. The closest date that we could acknowledge this is Friday 13th February.

The colour of the charity is blue, so on Friday 13th February we are asking all of the children to come to school dressed in blue and to pay £1 on School Money. Thank you for your support.

Identifying Vegetarians
